Longhorns Basketball Camp

Instruction

Day camps focus on improving fundamentals such as ball handling, passing, dribbling, team and individual defense, footwork, and shooting. Players will also get plenty of game experience through daily scrimmages. Campers are grouped by age and skill level, with a camper-to-coach ratio of roughly 8:1. All camp instruction will take place at Gregory Gym, The Rec Sports Center, Denton Cooley Pavilion, and/or the Frank Erwin Center.

Medications/ Trainers

Prescription medications should be given to the camp staff at check-in. Please place medications in a zip-loc bag with written instructions, dosage amounts, and times. If your camper is taking an over the counter medication and is responsible enough to take the medication on their own, they may keep it with them/in their room. Our trainers will be available at check-in to discuss any specific health or safety concerns. Licensed and experienced athletic trainers are on duty to administer medical attention to all minor injuries and sickness, as well as monitor levels of hydration. For serious problems, the UT Health Center is also available.

Drop-Off/ Pick- Up

All campers under the age of 16 must be dropped off/picked up from Jester West Dormitory by a parent, guardian, or team coach/chaperone. If a camper is old enough, and has permission from their parent or guardian, they may drive themselves to camp. Campers are responsible for finding their own parking in accordance with UT Parking and Transportation Services guidelines. Camp Staff may collect the keys of campers who drive themselves to team camp, as an extra safety precaution.

Safety

Every member of our staff has undergone a comprehensive criminal background check and completed training for child abuse awareness and reporting. With a camper-to-staff ratio of about 8:1, our staff of coaches and counselors maintain constant supervision. The Athletics Department subscribes to the WeatherData, Inc. SkyGuard® monitoring and alerting service. Directors are immediately notified and will remove campers from any potentially dangerous situations.

Housing

For Team Camp, Jester Dormitory is professionally staffed with 24-hour on-site security. Campers are not allowed to leave the housing facility or camp without supervision. During team camp, all campers must return to the dorms by 11pm.

Visitation

Parents are welcome to watch any Team Camp games in Gregory Gym, the Rec Sports Center, or Denton Cooley Pavilion (limited seating). Parents and guests are only allowed in the campers' rooms during the check in period. After that, living floors will only be available to camp participants and staff.

Discipline

Misbehavior can negatively impact the experience of others and our camp staff will make every effort to ensure that does not happen. We ask that all campers treat each other and the camp staff with respect, follow all rules, and exhibit behavior that has a positive impact on fellow campers. Failure to do so will result in a meeting with the Camp Director, contacting of parent or guardian, and possible removal from camp. Campers and/or parents may be asked to sign a discipline contract at camp check-in.

Youth Protection

All summer programs involving minors at The University of Texas at Austin follow guidelines set forth by the Youth Protection Program (YPP). The purpose of the YPP is to promote the safety of minors participating in camps or programs on university premises or participating in those programs sponsored or supported by the University. All camps and programs work closely with the YPP Manager to ensure that every program operates in accordance with all of the university's policies, rules and regulations, as well as the laws of The State of Texas regarding the safety of minors. <u>Social Media Communication</u>	Designated individuals will set their social media accounts to private for the duration of the camp. Personal emails, text messages, phone calls, and private social media communications with campers are not allowed.
<u>Post Camp Communication</u>	Campers may stay in contact with the camp director, faculty or staff via the camp/program social media accounts on Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter. Personal emails, text messages, phone calls, and private social media communications with camp staff and faculty are not allowed.

<u>Concealed Carry</u>	<p>On June 1, 2015, Gov. Greg Abbott signed S.B. 11, also known as the "campus carry" law. S.B. 11 provides that license holders may carry a concealed handgun throughout university campuses, starting Aug. 1, 2016. The law gives public universities some discretion to regulate campus carry.</p> <p>The University of Texas at Austin and President Gregory L. Fenves take issues surrounding guns on campus very seriously and will strive to create policies that conform to the new law, protect the rights of citizens and ensure the safety and security of the entire campus.</p> <p>S.B. 11 provides that after consulting with students, staff and faculty regarding "the nature of the student population, specific safety considerations and the uniqueness of the campus environment" the university may enact reasonable rules and regulations regarding:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • carrying of concealed handguns by license holders on campus; and • storage of handguns in dormitories or other residential facilities <p>The law stipulates, however, that these rules and regulations may not either "generally prohibit" or "have the effect of generally prohibiting" license holders from carrying concealed handguns on campus. The purpose of the Youth Protection Program (YPP) is to protect all minors in their university-sponsored activities and interactions involving members of The University of Texas at Austin community. Pursuant to S.B. 11 (the "Campus Carry Law"), the YPP Policy prohibits the carrying of a concealed handgun by any person involved in a University of Texas at Austin camp/program for minors.
